My name is Julissa and I live in Harrisburg PA 17104 and a member of the St. Francis of Assisi Church. I am a College student and work with the Movement of Immigrant Leaders in Pennsylvania in order to educate our community about their rights. I started working with them at 12 years old when I noticed the necessity of having a driver's license in one's day to day life.

In the state of PA it is necessary to have a driver's license in order to access basic necessities such as kids education, food, medical treatment, or ability to work. Here in Dauphin county our public transportation is scarce in certain areas, such as where I live, and is even worse in other counties throughout PA. With it not being reliable we resort to walking long distances in all temperatures in order to be able to complete our day to day tasks. Furthermore my siblings have become scared of local police that one routine traffic stop will tear our family apart. In order for my mom not to be at risk driving my dad worked two jobs to put food on our tables while endangering his life.

Becoming a part of MILPA and the Driving PA Forward Coalition I stopped thinking that this is how life had to be for us. This issue has impacted thousands of families through the years and has only worsened with this pandemic. We are fighting for a drivers license for all on a moral ground. We are making a call to your humanity also to see us as human beings and support a driver's license for all.
